Beatrice E. Clarke, age 91, of Passaic, NJ passed away peacefully on Wednesday, August 24, 2011 at St. Mary's Hospital in Passaic, NJ. She was born on September 22, 1919, in Ocho Rios, Jamaica, W.I. to James and Martha (Francis) Walker. She attended elementary school in Parry Town and after graduation from the 6th grade she worked as a Cook before moving to Kingston Jamaica where she met and married Granville Clarke (deceased) on February 2, 1950. She migrated to United States in 1965 and was initially employed as a Housekeeper. Subsequent training led to her employment as a Nurse's Aide at the Hamilton Plaza (previously known as Columbia Nursing Home) in Passaic where she worked until she retired at the age of 74. Sister Clarke was a faithful member of The Mt. Moriah Baptist Church where she taught Sunday School and also served on The Mothers Board of the Church, she was a longtime member of the N.A.A.C.P.
