Olabisi A. Obahnjoko (Victoria Stephens) passed away at the age of 75 on Thursday, 2:57 Am on April 30th, 2020 at King David Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation in Brooklyn, New York(Coney Island). She was born October 22, 1944 in Brooklyn, New York to Naomi(Mother) and Ward (Biggie) Stephens(father). Olabisi graduated from Clara Barton High School, she then proceeded to acquire various jobs as a secretary which then led to her working in a private sector for nursing.
